### ACQUISITION & DUE-IN SYSTEM (ADIS) & CONTRACTING INFORMATION DATABASE SYSTEM (CIDS)



- Scope of work: Support includes but is not limited to software development and maintenance; help desk and production support; compliance such as Financial Improvement and Audit Readiness (FIAR) and Standard Financial Information Structure (SFIS); and technical liaison support for Headquarters (HQ) Air Force Materiel Command (AFMC)/A4N, Air Force Sustainment Center (AFSC)/LGPS, and HQ AFMC/PK (e.g., portfolio managers and customers). Additional responsibilities include development of architectural and interface documentation; preparation of Security Technical Implementation Guidance (STIG) documentation necessary to obtain Authority to Operate (ATO); and support for taskers, subsumption, decommission, and audits.
- Anticipated Dollar Value: ~ \$6M \$7M
- Anticipated Acquisition Strategy: 8(a) Direct Award
- Anticipated Period of Performance: January 2026 January 2031
- Current State: Final Option year for current sustainment contract
- Priorities/Challenges/Opportunities: Priority Conversion of File Transfer Protocol (FTP) interfaces to Secured File Transfer Protocol (SFTP)
- Future considerations: The primary focus remains on the planned migration of ADIS to ESCAPE, anticipated in September 2027

- Scope of work: Provide operational support and software development/maintenance for PRPS, to include system performance monitoring, provide operational troubleshooting support, evaluate product backlog items, conduct agile software development, software security/vulnerabilities, and provide database administration and support.
- Anticipated Dollar Value: ~\$16M − \$20M
- Anticipated Acquisition Strategy: FAR 16.5 Small Business Enterprise Applications Solutions (SBEAS)
- Anticipated Period of Performance: January 2026 January 2031
- Current State: Final Option year for current sustainment contract
- Priorities/Challenges/Opportunities: Priority reducing technical debt, Opportunity continued maturity with Agile Software Development
- Future considerations: Provide more automation and continuous integration/continuous delivery (CI/CD) capabilities for PRPS

### CARGO AND PERSONNEL MOVEMENT FAMILY OF SYSTEMS (CPM FOS)



- Scope of work: Provide support to Cargo Movement Operations System (CMOS), On-Line Vehicle Interactive Management System (OLVIMS), Movement Automated Records Keeping System (MARKS), and other applications as assigned to the Transportation Systems Section. The contractor must provide CPM FoS life cycle support activities, which are divided in three service groups: Business Services, Customer and Functional Services, and Technical Services. Life cycle support includes management functions, operations, security, test, integration, implementation, training, sustainment, and help desk support. The Government will collaborate with industry to enhance system capabilities and maintain the existing system and product using Agile continuous development methodologies.
- Anticipated Dollar Value: ~ \$44.5M
- Acquisition Strategy: Small Business Enterprise Applications Solutions (SBEAS)
- Anticipated Period of Performance: August 2025 August 2030 (tentative)
- Current State: Extension of Service bridge contract
- Priorities/Challenges/Opportunities: Priority reduce technical debt, transition CMOS to a cloud environment, establish a release battle rhythm for all programs, continue to acclimate to the agile model.
- Future considerations: Streamline CPM processes such as agile implementation, cybersecurity support, and engineering support; ultimately, modernizing cargo movement capabilities for the warfighter.

### INTEGRATED BUDGET DOCUMENTATION & EXECUTION SYSTEM (IDECS)



- Scope of work: To provide programmatic, functional and both general and specialized technical support to ensure
  publication, training, delivery, operation and management, maintenance, sustainment and release of IDECS AF (DAF
  & USAF) budget justification materials to intended recipients
- Anticipated Dollar Value: ~\$3.5M (based on Estimated Deployment Date for SAF/FM's consolidation efforts)
- Anticipated Acquisition Strategy: FAR 16.5
- Anticipated Period of Performance: September 2026 December 2027
- Current State: Sustainment and Implementation IGA-SailPoint
- Priorities/Challenges/Opportunities:
  - Two major outputs/year -- Budget Estimate Submission (~1 August mid-September); President's Budget (~late-December – first Monday in February)
  - Address maintenance (cybersecurity impacts mitigations; software maintenance; backlog)
- Future considerations: (automation/tools, critical milestones/events, migration schedule)
  - Awaiting SAF/FM Portfolio determination (direction/roadmap) for IDECS
    - Estimated start date FY26 (Oct 2025); Estimated deployment date FY28 (Dec 2027)

#### LOGISTICS MODULE (LOGMOD)

- Scope of work: The U.S. Air Force (USAF) seeks to sustain, ensure continuity of operational service, and enhance system functionality for end-users utilizing a product team for support of LOGMOD. This includes user story collaboration, needs analysis, coordination of design, software development, incorporating Risk Management Framework (RMF) concepts to meet RMF objectives, code and unit testing, database and system administration, integration testing, implementation, and sustainment. These continuous development projects will use Agile development principles, with robust documentation, user-centered design, and an extensible infrastructure. During the contract period the government expects to transition the system from a JAVA/Oracle code base to a SalesForce low-code / no-code system. Refactoring will be performed by the Government Innovation Team with follow on contract support.
- Anticipated Dollar Value: ~\$3.5M − \$4.5M
- Anticipated Acquisition Strategy: 8(a) Direct Award
- Anticipated Period of Performance: April 2026 March 2029
- Current State: Sustainment
- Priorities/Challenges/Opportunities: Transition from current code base to SalesForce
- Future considerations: Continue development w/ interface partner requirements

These continuous development projects will use agile development principles with robust documentation, usercentered design, and an extensible infrastructure.

- Anticipated Acquisition Strategy: 8(a) Direct Award
- Anticipated Period of Performance: April 2026 March 2029
